## THE INTERVIEW

**ANGI:** How often to you get lost in a story?

Nancy Drew, The Hardy Boys, and lots of comic books followed, and then I read *The Good Earth* when I was about twelve. That book stills entrances me!

ANGI: What turns you off like nothing else? NANCY: Pretension and lying. I cannot abide either.

ANGI: Is writing or story-telling easier for you? NANCY: I hope I do both as I write my books!

ANGI: What's something you'd like to tell your fans? NANCY: My heartfelt thanks! I'm honored by each reader, and I answer every e-mail ... even if it takes a few days.

**ANGI'S GOTTA ASK:** So, Nancy, I have to admit that the Vampire way of life is hard for me to get into. I just have a hard time with the whole "undead" thing. Can you explain the appeal? And why would someone (like me) who isn't attracted to vampires want to read your book?
